

The Southeastern Chapter Notorious for Procrastination

It's not too big a problem when we meet at the Marriot in Charlotte. It's not that the Marriot isn't a nice hotel, it is. It's just that the demand for rooms in Charlotte is moderate, and the hotel is usually happy to accommodate those who can't make up their mind until somewhat beyond the "last minute." But often when we travel to more exciting and exotic locations I get those phone calls: "I just called the hotel and they say they don't have anything available. Is there anything you can do to help?" In 2007 we exceeded our block by ten or fifteen percent at the King and Prince Resort on St. Simon's Island, and fortunately the hotel was able to extend the contract rate to *most* of our late callers.

But the Grove Park Inn Resort & Spa is one of the most exclusive and expensive hotels we have ever used for our Fall Conference. Our negotiating has been lengthy and our planning cautious and conservative. We have obtained an extraordinarily attractive room rate for this conference but our block is limited and *will be reduced* if it

appears that we are going to have difficulty selling out.

On the other hand, once our room block is sold out, additional rooms will be sold at the contract rate *only* if the resort has more than 100 "run of the house" rooms still available in the hotel inventory. This means that the longer you wait to make your reservation, the better chance you will have of paying the "prevailing" rate for your room or suffering the intense disappointment of not getting a room at all.

A Special Word to Our Exhibitors

Just as with room block and rate availability as described above, at this point our Exhibit Hall has space limited to only thirty (30) display tables, and these will be sold (as always) on a first-come first-served basis. Although the exhibit schedule and reservation fee for tables has not yet been finalized, we strongly urge you to make plans now and be ready to reserve your table as soon as the Fall Conference registration package becomes available. Remember, subscribers on our email list receive newsletters, announcements and registration information days before those who receive only "snail-mail."

This Fall Conference promises to be something very special. Please don't miss it or pay more than you have to because you kept looking for "the last minute."
