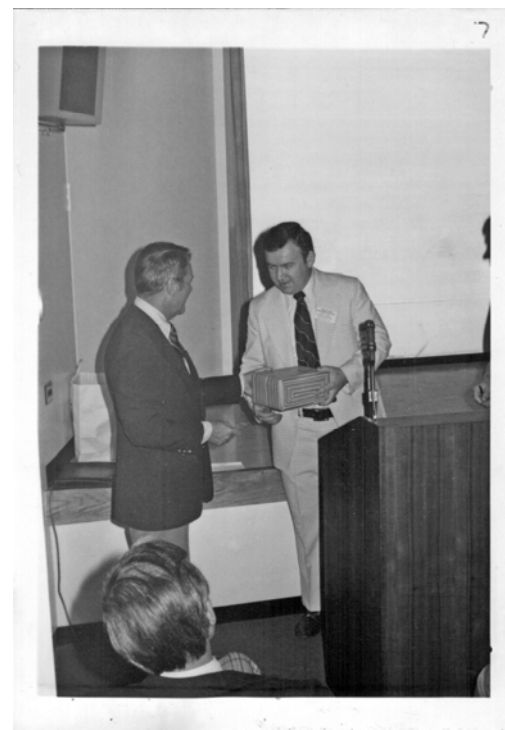

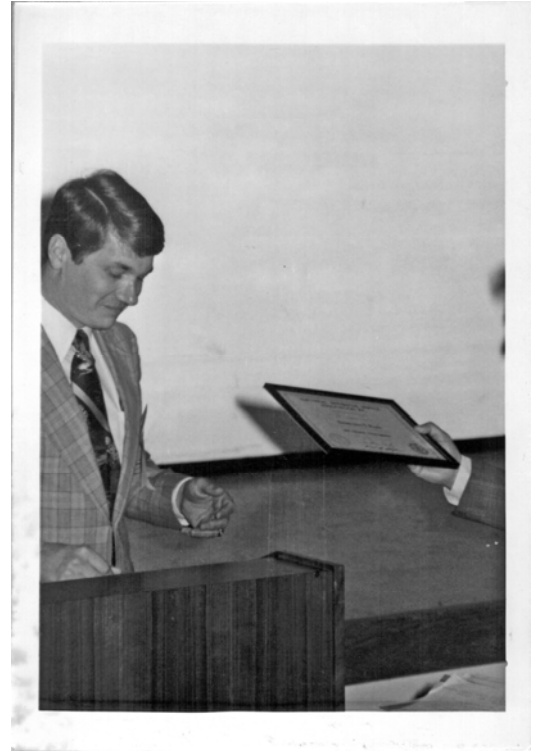

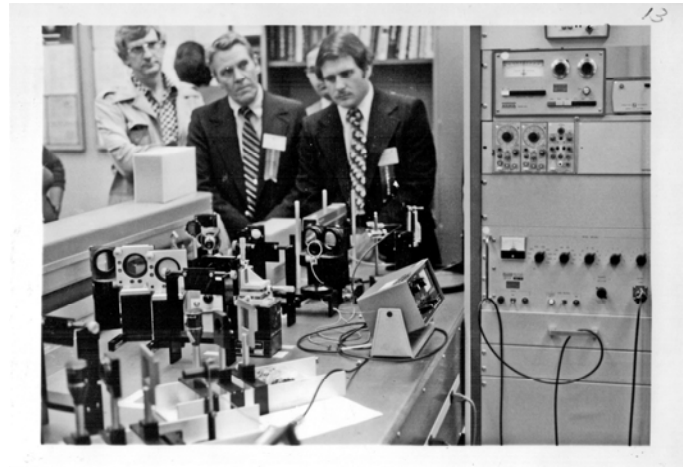

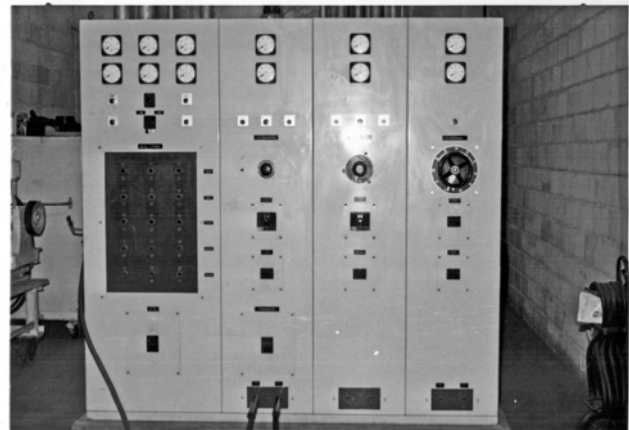

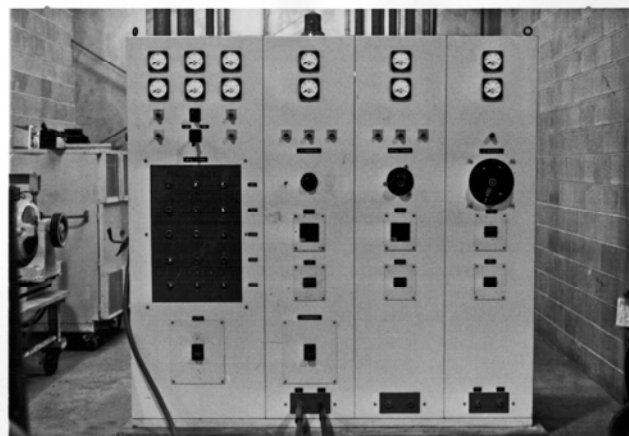

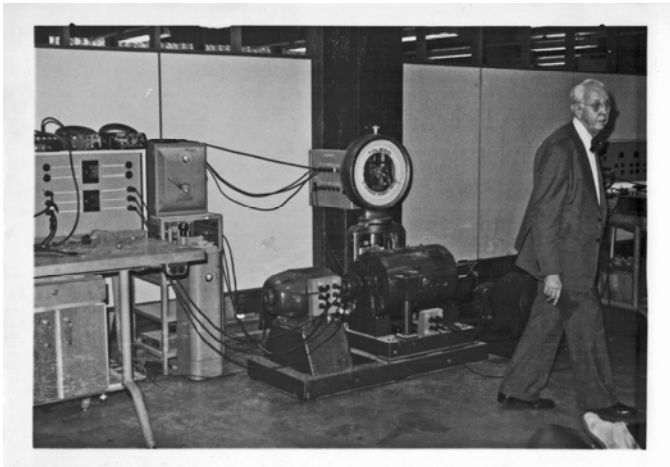


Part of Georgia Tech's Engineering Department Tour.

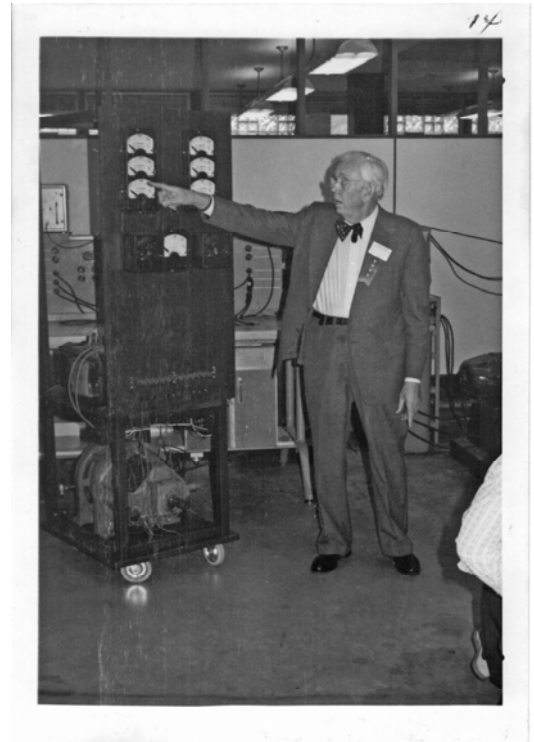

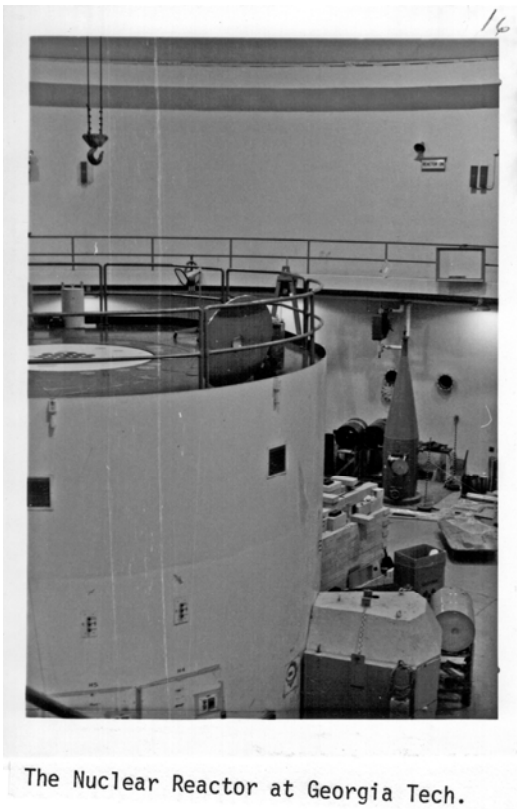




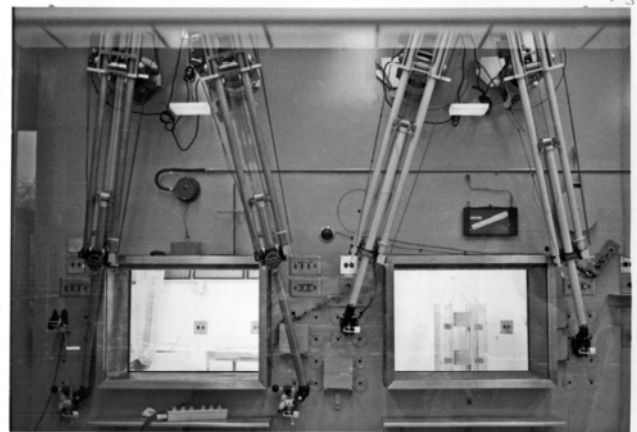

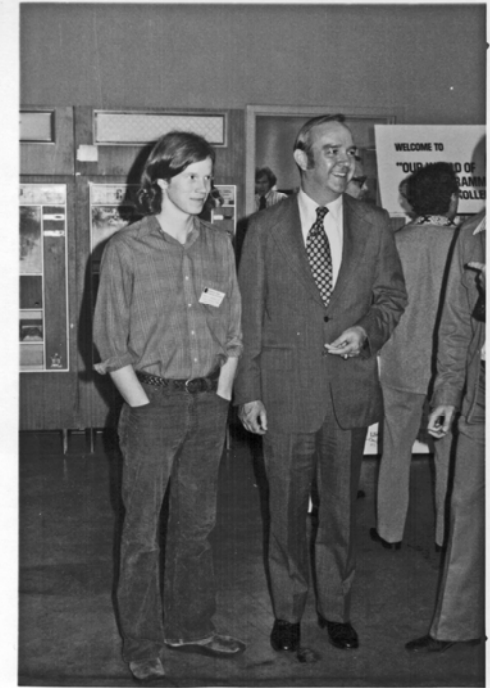
The Nuclear Reactor at Georgia Tech.



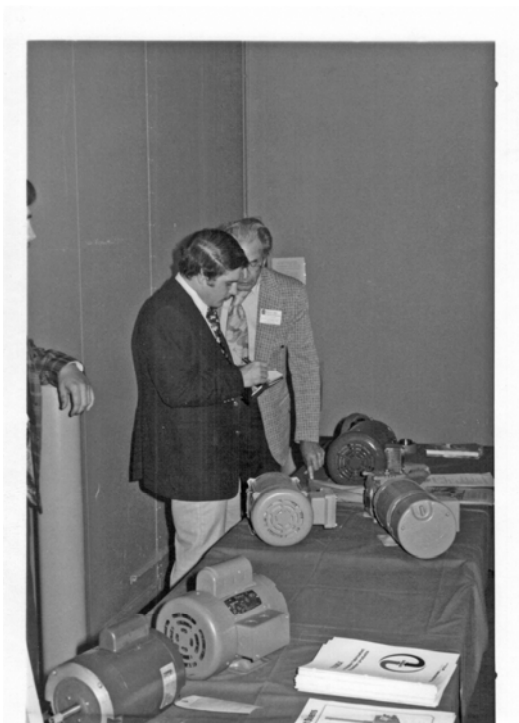
The Hot Cell of the Nuclear Reactor which was toured by EASA members.

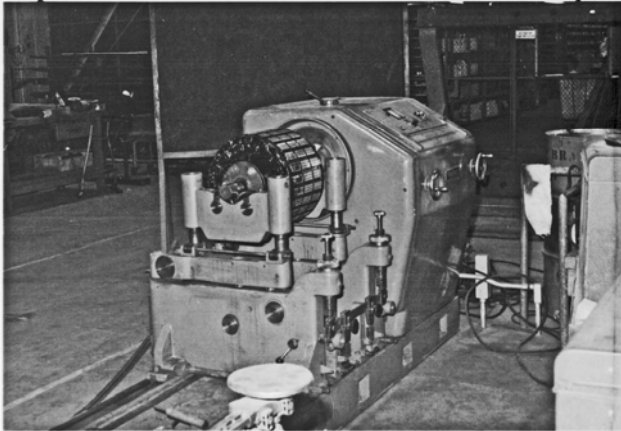

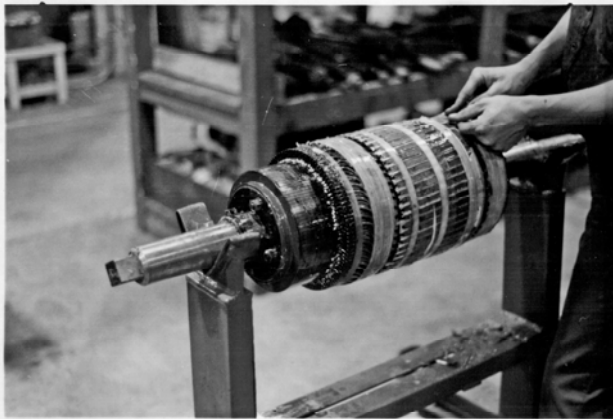

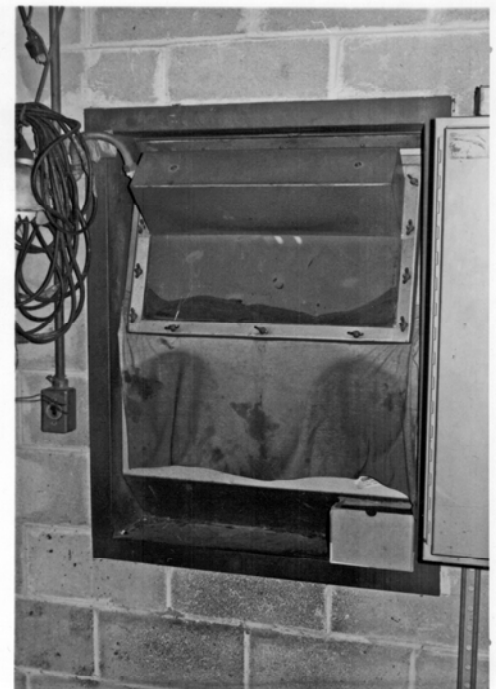

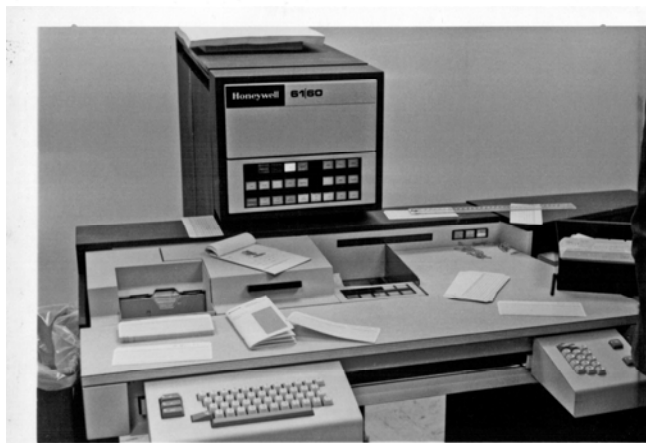

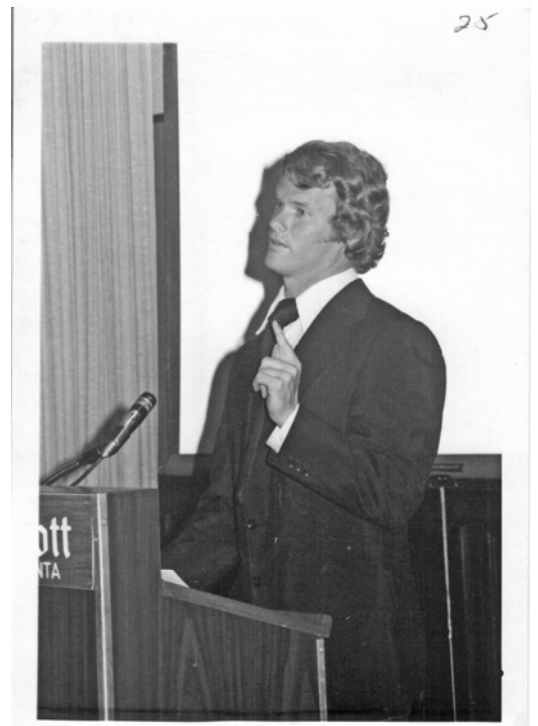

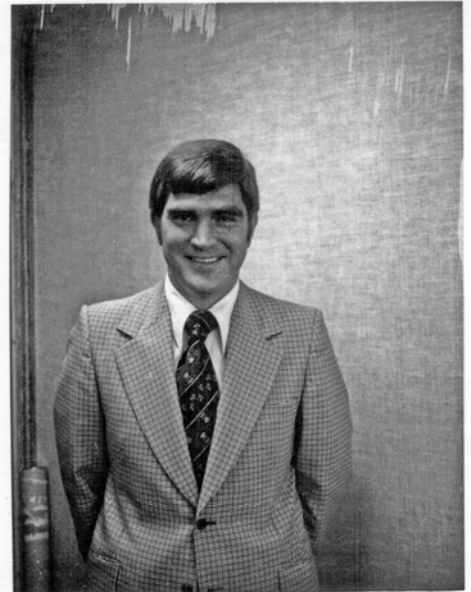

Dr. Ellington Darden of Nautilus Sports/Medical Industries was the first speaker of the day. His topic was "The Most Neglected Factor in Golf."



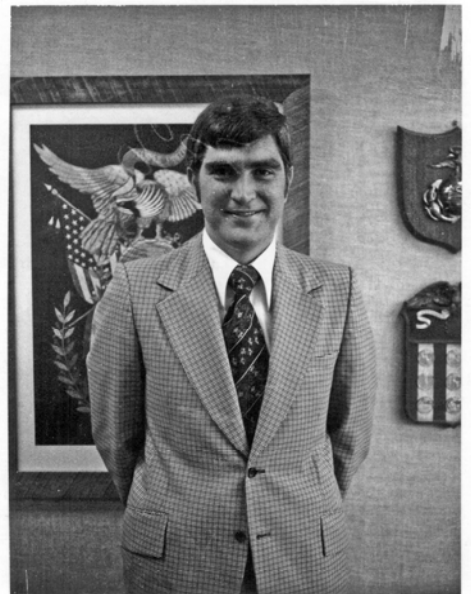
Mr. William A. Frankel, of Wolf and Company, spoke on "The Independent Auditor--What He Can do For You".

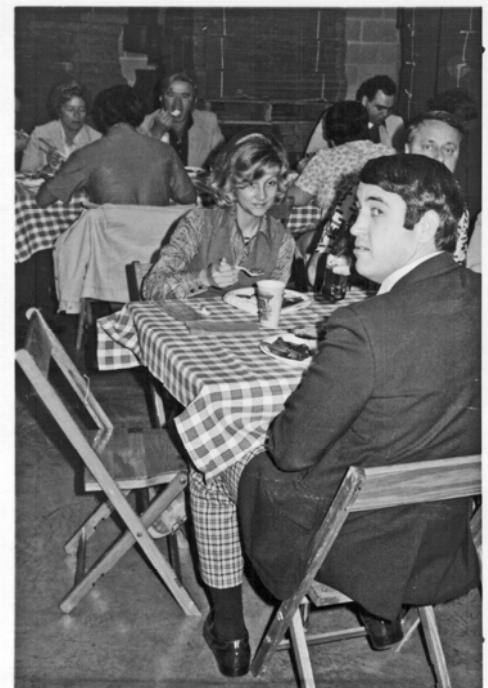
